Roundhill Campsite Brockenhurst
Final Details

- Welcome:** We look forward to welcoming you to the New Forest for the qualifying round of the Compass Sport Cup and Trophy.
- Location:** The car park and event centre are at Roundhill Campsite - former site of buildings belonging to Beaulieu Airfield in the Second World War. The entrance is on the south side of the B3055 approx 2 miles East of Brockenhurst at grid ref SU 328025. The nearest postcode is SO42 7QL. Follow the permanent road signs.
After heavy rain the B3055 can flood where it goes under the railway line near Brockenhurst. Look for the depth gauge. If in doubt turn around and head towards Lymington, then turn left (east) immediately after the level crossing in Brockenhurst. This will bring you back onto the B3055 on the right side of the problem.
- Parking:** Parking is on the hard standing areas within the campsite. The parking fee is £1 per car. Please have change ready.

- Facilities:** Toilets. Tom and Julie Wilkinson's catering van.
- Entry:** Entry to the Compass Sport Cup and Trophy is via club captains only. Light Green and Yellow (non-competition) courses can also be entered this way or by entry on the day.
- Fees:** Competition entries must be made in advance through club captains who have been provided with details of the fees.
For entries on the day the following fees apply:
Light Green £10 (seniors) £5 (juniors)
Yellow £4 (seniors and juniors)
EMIT hire £1.50 (seniors) £NIL (juniors)
- Courses:** There will be the full range of CSC competition courses. You will be allocated to the appropriate course by your club captain.
There will be two non-competition courses - Light Green and Yellow.

- British Orienteering:** All those entering competition courses MUST be members of British Orienteering. Entries will be checked against the BO membership list.
- Map:** Scale 1:10,000, updated 2018/19. Loose control descriptions will be at the start.
- Terrain:** Typical New Forest terrain of open heathland and runnable woodland.

- Start:** About 500 metres from the event centre.
- Start times:** For competition entries will be allocated by club – please refer to your club captain.
For non-competition courses go to the start and take the next available slot.
- Finish:** In the event centre, with spectators able to view the run in. Download is adjacent.
- Club tents:** Are welcome in the designated area.
- Clothing:** Full leg cover must be worn. Whistles should be carried. In adverse weather we may ask you to wear a cagoule or similar waterproof top.
- Bio-security:** Please come to the event with clean and dry shoes and clothing. After your run please follow the guidance that helps protect our precious environment:
- Check
 - Clean
 - Dry
- Before leaving the event **check** your clothing and equipment and remove any mud, soil or leaf litter.
Once home thoroughly **clean** your footwear and clothing and then leave it to **dry** for as long as possible.
- Hazards:** Near the event centre there is a small pond.
The walk to the start is along the access road into the campsite: please take care.
There is a log pile near the start which must not be climbed on.
Adults with children please take responsibility for their safety.
Longer courses cross the B3055 in two places. There is good visibility and a 40MPH speed limit. The crossings will be manned but competitors are responsible for their own safety.
Please be aware of the risk of ticks and Lyme disease.
There are cattle and ponies in the area, very likely including the campsite. Please do not approach them. They can occasionally react badly to dogs and for this reason you are asked not to bring dogs to the event.

Safety: The safety bearing is south and east (to the campsite).
Courses close at 14:00 hrs.
Competitors attending the event alone **MUST** leave their car key at Registration.
All competitors must report to Download even if retiring from the event.
Orienteering is a physically challenging sport. Competitors take part at their own risk.

Photography and O-Safe: There are no official photographers for this event. Photography is not allowed in the toilets or any “changing area” including the car park.
Any concerns with photography or the behaviour of anyone toward any child or young adult must be reported to the event organiser or other official.
Safeguarding is everyone’s responsibility, play your part, report any concerns and put good practice into effect.

Dogs: Are not permitted.

Risk assessment: A comprehensive risk assessment has been carried out by the organiser and will be available to read at the event. Participants take part at their own risk and are responsible for their own safety during the event.

Insurance: The British Orienteering insurance policy provides public liability cover. Please note that if you have competed in three orienteering events and have not joined an orienteering club that is a member of British Orienteering, then you are not covered by this insurance.

Medical conditions: If you have a **High Risk Medical Condition** you are invited to download and complete this form:

This can be left at registration. Envelopes will only be opened if required for a medical emergency. Unopened envelopes should be collected after the event. Any unclaimed envelopes will be destroyed after the event.

Event cancellation: If the event has to be cancelled for reasons beyond our control, SOC reserve the right to retain all or some of your entry fee to cover committed costs.
